Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities: Waitlist



- United members on the PRTF waitlist from January 1, 2019 to June 30, 2019: 164
- · Average length of time on the waitlist: 51 Days
- · Minimum time on the waitlist: 1 Day
- Maximum time on the waitlist: 205 Days
- % of children on the waitlist that are on the SED waiver: 43% (70/164)
- · Reasons children removed from waitlist:
 - · Guardian unable to be located
- Child improved
- · Admitted to bordering state PRTF
- · Admitted with other MCO, no waitlist information available
- · Member deceased, no further details available
- No response from guardian
- Member incarcerated



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Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities: Denial Reasons



- · Does not meet need for 24 hour residential care
- Not harming self or others
- · Previous PRTF stays with no improvement
- · Outpatient services have not been attempted or fully explored
- Does not present with psychotic symptoms
- · Needs medication evaluation that can be done in the community

Barriers To Additional Services



- Lack of Intensive Outpatient/Partial Hospital Program (IOP/PHP) for mental health in the state.
- Variances across the state in what CMHCs can provide.
- High acuity.
- · Lack of family involvement.
- Families don't want to engage with the CMHCs.
- Waiver services are not being accessed by those on the waiver.



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Recommendations



- Reinstate Intensive Outpatient/Partial Hospital Program (IOP/PHP) for BH to provide a more gradual step down or alternative to inpatient or PRTF.
- Implement family therapy without child present to support use of evidence based programs, such as Parent Management Training of Oregon (PMTO).



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UnitedHealthcare Response



- · Biweekly staffing of children on the waitlist with KDADS, DCF.
- All children on the waitlist are assigned a care coordinator.
- Pilot with KVC to support families of difficult children to keep them from disrupting from the home using in-lieu of funds.
- IOP with KidsTLC for children at risk of PRTF or needing intensive supports following discharge.

Kelly was excited to hear about the Tub Safety Bar and asked Crystal to order it. Crystal placed the order and the Tub Safety Bar was delivered via mail. Kelly's roommate was unable to install the Tub Safety Bar, so Crystal installed the safety bar for her. Kelly is very excited to be able to bathe independently and that the Tub Safety Bar has helped her a lot.

Dentures

Frail Elderly members can get one full set of dentures every 5 years.

Tina is a FE Waiver member who had joined UHC during the open enrollment period. She already had several missing teeth and her dental provider indicated that additional teeth needed to be extracted. She was already very self-conscious about her missing teeth and had begun to withdrawal from the things she loved to do, like go to church, visit with friends and family. Through her Care Coordinator, Sara, Tina learned about the denture Value Added Benefit. She was excited at the prospect of getting dentures. Sara worked with the UHC dental team and Tina's dental provider to get approval for Tina's dentures. Tina agreed to have the additional teeth extracted and then patiently waited for her gums to heal so that the denture work could be completed. Two weeks ago Tina got her new dentures. Tina's Care Coordinator could hear an excitement in Tina's voice that she'd never before. Tina is genuinely happy to begin going to the social activities she loves so much and not be self-conscious about her smile.
